

Signs to spot:

Slavery in the 21st century is often enforced by threats to the individual, coercion, abduction, fraud and deception. Victims range from men and women to children, they can be of all ages and backgrounds.

There are a number of signs that may indicate someone is the victim of slavery which include:

- · Abuse or malnourishment
- Appears to be under the influence of others
- No access to identification documents
- Living in overcrowded accommodation
- Paid no or too little money, less than the National Minimum Wage
- Work long hours over long periods, with no time off
- Forced to work in inadequate conditions
